

# **Civil War Living History in Audubon Mill Park**

Cobb's Battery and Adam Rankin Johnson Camp No. 1910 are hosting a Civil War Living History in Audubon Mill Park on Henderson's Riverfront March 28-30. The event is being presented in conjunction with the Henderson County Historical and Genealogical Society and the Depot Community Room. Also present will be the 15<sup>th</sup> Tennessee Infantry Company G; the 42<sup>nd</sup> Tennessee Infantry; King's Battery; and 3<sup>rd</sup> Kentucky Infantry, which includes members of the Orphan Brigade.

Events these days will include artillery drills, blacksmithing demonstrations, period cooking, sampling, and sewing; and sutler supply tents staffed by re-enactors in period dress. Highlights include cannon firing demonstrations by Cobb's Battery.

This event is free and open to public viewing all weekend.

8am- 2:30pm: blacksmithing demonstrations, period cooking and sampling, and supply tent re-enactments

2pm: Drilling, gun firing, and cannon firing
